#### **Important Points:**

Encumbered funds \$77K Promotions Prof. Consulting, Supplies, Electricity, & Plowing in Maintenance \$78K. Administration higher than this point last year because rent, taxes and parking paid earlier.

## Surplus projection

- --Revenues are right where they should be
- --Expenses are high, but things like rent and taxes have been paid in advance
- --Stowe and Fairpoint paid corporate sponsorships in advance
- --BED- looking at how to sustain cables in the ground and current electrical system, credit,
- --blocks treated differently because of the charter- state legislature

## VI. Executive Director's Report

a. Act 143, Changes to the Vermont Open Meeting Law- Discussion with Gregg Meyer, Assistant City Attorney

- Differences regarding emails?
  - Law changed so you can create a meeting via email, but it becomes a public meeting which requires minutes etc
  - Advice- refrain from discussing topics that should be discussed in an in person meeting
  - Members of commission giving direction is not the same as creating an email string to conduct business of the commission.
  - Exchanging ideas and sending it along is NOT conducting business.
  - People have a right to access this body and participate in deliberations
  - o Avoid "preparation" for meeting, talking about votes
  - o Putting discussions on the agenda for the next meeting
  - What is a public record? Everyone should have burlingtonvt.gov emails. If there was a public records request- all commissioners emails would be reviewed (Even private emails).
  - o Effort to get everyone on a city email account
  - If a commissioner has an idea or sees something on the street- put this topic on the agenda

Kelly Divine- New parking

Discussion on new parking system

285 new smart meters in downtown core- between Main and Cherry, South Winooski and Pine

Smart meter will accept credit cards and coins, will have no time limit, will be more expensive- \$150 an hour, will be enforced until 10 pm 5000 postcards printed to have at restaurants, stores, will be tabling on Church Street to get the word out, members of parking team will be walking around to answer questions on the first weekend, warning violation for the first two weeks, parking kiosks

- b. Update on Refresh of CSM Brand: Presentation by Chuck Mauro and Laura Cheney, Select Design
  - Have been working on event branding and will continue to through the end of the year
  - Refreshing the brand, not revolutionizing
  - Showed four logos
  - Feedback: Strength of current logo: outdoors, new logos don't reflect that
  - Simple is best
  - Positive feedback on first two
  - Needs to reflect the vibrancy of the street, shopping and dining
  - Thoughts on #4 Light post= symbol of safety
  - Logos could be more creative
